

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> KEY SIGHTS





FREE THE CATHEDRAL

An amazing feat of medieval architecture and art, Strasbourg's cathedral was the tallest building of the Christian world, until the 19th century. For over 400 years, generations of craftsmen from all over Europe worked on the construction of the cathedral, sometimes at vertiginous heights. Just imagine what it was like for those who stood in front of the completed cathedral for the first time...

The façade of the cathedral is a treasure trove of history. Just lift your eyes and get lost in the details. The time will fly by! Walk around the cathedral and have fun trying to find the statues of Jesus, Mary, Jonas and the whale, the Three Kings and the Devil. Play a little game: find the "good guys" and "bad guys", look for mythical and familiar animals, pick out the prophet with the best beard, vote for the ugliest gargoyle, and whatever else you can dream up... And if you've got some artistic flair, take pencil to paper and draw your favourite statue!

Noon. It's time to stand in front of the astronomical clock at the cathedral, a marvel of the Renaissance that still works perfectly to this day.

After a film show on the clock, at 12.30 p.m. on the dot, everything is set in motion: the 12 Apostles file past Jesus who blesses them. Right at the top of the clock, the cock crows three times... Not to be missed!

THE CATHEDRAL'S **PLATFORM**

The Cathedral spire stands 142 metres high. The platform is not guite as high, but it still takes 330 steps to get up there... not recommended for anyone scared of heights!

From up there, the view of the city and of the nearby Vosges and Black Forest mountains is **spectacular**. Simply fabulous!

From the platform, you can take a 360° journey through time, thanks to the VR Strasbourg Cathedral app (also available with a QR code). Thanks to 3D reconstructions, discover breathtaking views that will let you compare today's Strasbourg with the medieval 15th century town and the 18th century city. An exciting experience!

FREE THE PETITE FRANCE DISTRICT AND THE PANORAMIC TERRACE OF THE VAUBAN DAM

The **Petite France** quarter has many surprises in store for young explorers. Apart from its narrow cobbled streets and its picturesque half-timbered houses which remind us of the setting of a children's fairy tale, we can admire a lock where boats slowly rise, alongside a fun swing bridge which allows boats to pass.

Next, go to the **Ponts Couverts** (covered bridges) that once delineated Strasbourg's outer edge. It's the perfect spot to imagine you're a knight defending Strasbourg! In its high square towers, dating back to the 13th century, criminals and delinquents were imprisoned.

Opposite, you'll see the **Vauban Dam**. Dating back to the 17th century, it was designed to reinforce the medieval fortifications. Under its thirteen arches. mobile iron panels would be shifted in order to flood the city's southern side, to keep assailants from getting into Strasbourg.

Amateur photographers have the possibility to practice their skills on the **panoramic** terrace of the Vauban Dam, since it offers a magnificent view on the Petite France quarter.

HISTORICAL MUSEUM

Through a fun and interactive journey, this museum displays the city's history from the Middle Ages up to the year 1949.

You can touch the objects on display, ring a castiron bell and even try on an authentic helmet used as battle armour. A real journey through time!

FREE L'AUBETTE 1928

Have you ever entered into a work of art? Explore this former avant-garde leisure complex, which once featured a cinema/ dance hall, a café-bar where you could have a drink during a showing, and an impressive community hall. Here, from the floor to the ceiling, you're inside an artwork. Experience the simple shapes and colours surrounding you: with each step, the pace changes.

PALAIS ROHAN AND ITS MUSEUMS

A major architectural accomplishment of 18thcentury France, this sumptuous palace, located between the River Ill and the cathedral, is well worth a visit.

Built for the prince-bishop Armand Gaston of the House of Rohan, it was meant to be a compelling demonstration of French luxury and refinement in this province, which had only recently been annexed to the kingdom.

The palace, which offered a regal welcome to any royals travelling through the region, now boasts three remarkable museums. As you walk through them, you'll be following in the footsteps of King Louis XV, Napoleon and Josephine!

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DECORATIVE ARTS MUSEUM

In this beautiful museum you can walk through the former living quarters of the king and the princebishop. Why not play princes and princesses during your visit?

You'll also discover a ceremonial dinner service and a clock display, including a rooster said to be the oldest automaton in the world!

FINE ARTS MUSEUM

In each room of this museum, you'll find major masterpieces. Giotto, Raphael, Courbet... here you'll find some of the greatest painters of all time. Each painting tells a story. Immerse yourself in the details: admire the clothes and finery worn in the past, the incredible precision of the still lifes, the beauty of the landscapes, and more. It's an inspiring journey through 500 years of painting in Europe!



ARCHAEOLOGICAL MUSEUM

Did you know that in Alsace, right underneath our feet, there are treasures more than **600 000 years old?** These vestiges, found by archaeologists, tell the tale of our ancestors' daily life, from prehistoric times to the early Middle Ages. Explore their secrets through the objects they used.





TOMI UNGERER MUSEUM

Do you know about the "enfant terrible" of Strasbourg? He was quite a rascal, but he was very talented at drawing! Get to know the famous, crazy illustrator in the museum dedicated to him; look at hundreds of pictures including many illustrations for children's books - which tell a thousand stories...



Viewing stations are available, so you can sit down and watch comfortably.

ZOOLOGICAL MUSEUM

Ambling through the vast galleries of the Zoological Museum, the imagination runs wild. Naturalists are in their element; children stand and stare. VEARS LE VAISSEAU

Located at the entrance to the city, the Vaisseau is a fun way for the family to get to grips with science and technology.





THE ORANGERIE PARK

With its incredible vegetation, its lake, its boats and its waterfall, its storks and its three playgrounds, the Orangerie is a popular meeting place for walkers, families and joggers. It is also a welcome oasis during the hot summer months and a children's paradise.

The Empress Josephine, wife of Napoleon I, loved strolling through this park. The lodge in the middle of the park is actually named after her.

26 hectares of nature for relaxing, strolling, picnicking... and marvelling, in any season.

When the weather is nice, make sure you try out the Ecole de Conduite, an amusingly retro racetrack, and take a ride around the little lake in a rowboat, where you might see some swans and ducks. Your kids will love it!

THE BOTANICAL GARDEN

An amazing oasis in the heart of the city, the Botanical Garden is a favourite among dreamy and curious people. Covering an area of almost 3.5 hectares, this living museum is home to more than 6,000 different tree and plant species. Don't miss the tropical hothouse: it is teeming with rare and lush vegetation including treasures such as a traveler's tree, a giant bamboo and a fiddle leaf fig.

Kids love to explore the shady nooks and crannies of this garden, go all the way around **the little pond** and try to approach **the frogs**.

Built by Vauban in the years following 1681 and partially destroyed in 1870, the ramparts of the Citadelle Park now mark the boundaries of a magnificent space punctuated by playgrounds and waterways, where children and adults come to relax or let off steam... much to the amusement of turtles and ducks!

THE TWO SHORES GARDEN

A symbol of Franco-German friendship, this huge cross-border landscaped park extends across the Rhine River, connecting the cities of Strasbourg and Kehl, in Germany. It often hosts cultural activities, and it offers playground equipment to keep kids amused all day long.

A spectacular suspended footbridge, reserved for pedestrians and cyclists, spans the Rhine River and provides a wonderful vista point over the river. It's a perfect, highly symbolic place to take a picture...

POURTALÈS PARK

Located in the Robertsau quarter, the Pourtalès Park surrounds a **splendid manor** dating back to the 18th-19th centuries.

Countess Mélanie de Pourtalès would host dances and balls there, for all the high society of Europe.

Today, the park is home to numerous contemporary works of art set at random along the forest paths. Young and old alike enjoy the fun equipment, varied landscapes and endless lawns, perfect for running around and having fun.

FRIEDEL WILDLIFE PARK

At the heart of the Girlenhirsch recreation area, on the banks of the River Ill, the Friedel Wildlife Park is a unique place in greater Strasbourg. Across more than 5 acres of land, the park brings visitors into direct contact with a wide variety of domestic animals.

Goats, alpacas, pigs, ponies, donkeys, chickens and peacocks roam the park freely... It's a wonderful place for discovering and observing the world of animals, for all ages. And, for the youngest visitors, it provides great opportunities for impressive encounters, always very touching.

FREE FORT KLEBER PARK

Created around a former military fort dating back to the late 19th century, Fort Kléber Park is a vast nature area with gently rolling hills. Visitors often spot squirrels, pheasants and pairs of mallard ducks.

A pleasant, invigorating new garden, the **Jardin des Cinq Sens**, was added recently. The farmyard, with its goats, peacocks, chickens and star pig, Coco, the pond and the playground are all popular with kids

Add a bit of culture into the mix by following the historical tour route to learn about the history of the fort.

THE MUNICIPAL BATHS

Have you ever gone for a swim in a historical monument? Located at the heart of Strasbourg, in the Neustadt district, these Roman-style baths, which are more than a century old, offer a wonderful setting for a fun splash. Surrounded by copper fixtures, marble tiles, a fountain, a sculpted, vaulted ceiling and intricate woodwork... your experience will be unforgettable!

WACKEN SWIMMING POOL

Highly appreciated by both serious swimmers and families, the Wacken swimming pool is open year-round, and adapts to the seasons. With an open-air swimming pool (heated in winter), a wellbeing and swimming instruction pool, a solarium and shallow summer pools, the Wacken swimming centre offers something for everyone.

HAUTEPIERRE SWIMMING POOL

At the Hautepierre swimming pool, there's something for everyone, in every season: an indoor pool with a long, winding tunnel slide, a heated outdoor pool, so you can swim year-round and stay warm, and a tree-lined, grass-covered solarium...

In summer, kids have fun on the outdoor slide, and the little ones splash around safely in small paddling pools, water play areas and dry playgrounds designed especially for them.

LINGOLSHEIM **SWIMMING POOL**

Kids love the original shape of this pool, which looks like a flying saucer. Covered in winter and open in summer, it features a swimming pool, a leisure pool, a wading pool and outdoor areas with a solarium and water play areas.


